2020 A day starting with miracles

- You have received earlier email information from the Emergency Room of a hospital, where I took my mother at 4:00 a.m. local time.
- It is extremely hard to manage a Zoom meeting such as Tnano20 from a hospital. I was desperate, since Zoom session Z13 was supposed to start earlier, at 08:15 EDT.
- So far, there were no technical glitches (except for presentation I11 that was interrupted by loss of internet communication with Serbia). This is a miracle on its own.

- I arrived home in time to seat mother on a sofa and to start Zoom session Z13 on time as if nothing had happened. I consider this a third miracle.
- Many Tnano20 participants (19) are joining now for the second broadcast of presentation I11 by Igor Popov. This is 45 minutes before I33.
